**Mutual of Omaha Celebrates 2nd National Month of Caring
More than 5,700 Volunteer Hours and Nearly \$50,000 in Grants Provided**

Mutual of Omaha employees participated in projects ranging from construction and landscaping at various non-profit facilities to sorting and organizing donations from the community. More than 5,700 hours were spent volunteering during the month, while nearly \$50,000 in grants were awarded to help facilitate the volunteer projects.
