Roundtable Awarded Gold President's Volunteer Service Award by Junior Achievement

Washington, D.C.—April 6, 2011—Junior Achievement awarded the Gold President's Volunteer Service Award for 2009-2010 to the Financial Services Roundtable last night. Steve Bartlett, President and CEO of the Roundtable accepted the award on behalf of the company. The award was bestowed to the Roundtable for providing over 15,000 volunteer hours to Junior Achievement sponsored events.

“Junior Achievement and the Roundtable have a shared goal of empowering young people in the U.S. with the tools and knowledge to be financially responsible,” said Steve Bartlett. “Besides volunteering individually, we're taking the debate straight to Congress, in the hopes that financial literacy will no longer be a luxury for the fortunate few, but a mandated course for future generations.”

In 2010, the Roundtable entered into a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) with Junior Achievement to provide 25,000 volunteers for financial literacy programs by 2013, an approximate four-percent annual increase in volunteers from Roundtable member organizations.

The Financial Services Roundtable represents 100 of the largest integrated financial services companies providing banking, insurance, and investment products and services to the American consumer. Member companies participate through the Chief Executive Officer and other senior executives nominated by the CEO.

Roundtable member companies provide fuel for America's economic engine, accounting directly for \$92.7 trillion in managed assets, \$1.2 trillion in revenue, and 2.3 million jobs.
